




GTI Observatory aggregates key stakeholders to:

Coalition for tenders

The **GTI Observatory** continuously monitors international calls for application of innovative solutions in islands. One of our objectives is to create qualified coalitions for tenders. A successful example is the **MAESHA H2020 Project**.





MAESHA H2020 - Innovative smart grid projects

MAESHA Project will demonstrate smart and flexible solutions for a decarbonized energy future in the French island of Mayotte, while other European islands – Wallis and Futuna Islands, St Barthélémy, Canary Islands, Favignana, Gozo – will study their replicability potential. MAESHA will implement advanced smart platforms aggregating multiple flexibility services to the grid that will help reach up to 70-100% of renewable energy sources penetration.

MAESHA kicked off in November 2020. The project has been presented during the e_Convention of Greening the Islands, partner of the project.

Access to all Island Member - Entry and Intermediate levels benefits, plus a deeper support from GTI that includes:

Main steps - dedicated to on-line technical sessions (energy, water, mobility & waste)

- 1. Agreement with the island government to cooperate in the GTI Observatory;
- 2. Creation of a **local task force** for the island, involving all key stakeholders for the sustainable transition;
- 3. Compilation of the questionnaire (that give also the right to take part to the Global Index);
- 4. Elaborating the answers to the questionnaire with first ideas of potential solutions/projects;
- **5.** Workshop with local task force hosted by the local government;
- 6. Minutes/report with the results of the meeting with the identification of priorities and potential projects/initiatives to decarbonise the island;
- 7. Call for proposals to the innovative solution providers, research centres, universities, etc.;
- **8. Selection of the best proposals for the island** by the task force;
- 9. Event for presentations of the best solutions and discussion;
- 10. Final report to be utilised for the lobby and to attract investments;
- 11. Analysis of the financing opportunities and business models. Participation to calls from institutions.






